Introduction

In spring/summer 2017, exit surveys were distributed to master's students graduating from Berklee College of Music and the Boston Conservatory at Berklee. The surveys were administered as students picked up their cap and gown for their respective commencements, and reminder emails were subsequently sent to students who had not completed the surveys, resulting in an 88 percent response rate. The surveys collected each student's permanent contact information, post-graduation plans, and feedback on their experiences at Berklee.

The report below is separated into two sections, first the results of Berklee College of Music graduate students, and second, Boston Conservatory at Berklee graduate students.

Berklee College of Music

Primary activity after graduation

Over half of graduating students from Berklee College of Music's graduate programs reported their primary activity after graduation as employed, self-employed, or in an internship. Just over one-third of respondents were seeking employment, while nine percent were accepted or enrolled in continuing education programs. Complete breakdowns by program are available in Table 3 below.

Fifty-six percent of respondents will be engaging in their primary activity in the United States, while the rest will be in one of 23 other countries. Of the respondents whose primary activity will be in the United States, nearly one-third will be in Massachusetts, followed by California and New York. Fifty-eight percent of respondents are legally authorized to work in the United States.

Employment and internships

The 21 respondents who selected "employed" as their primary activity answered additional questions about their employment. Approximately half are working in part-time positions and half in full-time positions; just over half are paid on an annual basis. Only three respondents shared their annual salary, with an average salary of \$55,000. Five respondents shared their hourly wage, ranging from \$15 to \$50 per hour. A full list of employers and job titles is available in Appendix A, and a list of internship employers is available in Appendix B.

Performing arts-related employment

Seventy-nine percent of the respondents who reported being employed or working in an internship indicated that their work is performing arts-related. Twenty-eight percent are in performance, 22 percent in education, and 17 percent in business within the performing arts.

Continuing education

Thirteen respondents selected continuing education as their primary activity after graduation: ten will be enrolled in other degree/certificate programs, and three will be enrolled in an additional master's program. Nine of those enrolled in other degree/certificate programs are enrolled in Berklee College of Music post-master's fellowships (5 in programs in Boston, and 4 in Valencia). Professional representation

In addition to their immediate career plans, graduate students were asked if they have professional representation such as an agent or manager. Five percent of all respondents currently have professional representation.

Career Center

Graduate students were asked how often they used the Career Center (Boston Career Center or International Career Center in Valencia). Eighty-nine percent of respondents used center services, resources, and/or programs at least once; 25 percent used a center at least once a semester, with 11 percent using a career center four or more times per semester.

Satisfaction

Graduate students were asked to rank their satisfaction with their overall experience, their program of study, their professors, and events and activities at Berklee College of Music. Respondents were most satisfied with their overall experience and their program of study, followed by satisfaction with their professors, and activities and events. Graduate students from the Master of Arts in Music Therapy low-residency program were asked about their satisfaction with their online courses; 64 percent reporting being satisfied or very satisfied.

Graduate students were asked if they would recommend Berklee College of Music to others. Eighty-six percent of respondents indicated they were likely to recommend the college, with 58 percent being extremely likely to recommend the college. Finally, graduate students were asked to rank their satisfaction with how well their program prepared them for the next stage in their career. Additional Questions for Valencia Graduates

Graduating students in the four master's degree programs on Berklee College of Music Valencia campus were asked additional questions about their experience with campus and technology services, students services, the career center, and social media.

Student services

Graduate students in Valencia were asked to rank their satisfaction with four services of the Student Affairs Office. On average, there was a 63 percent satisfaction² rate with these services. Respondents expressed higher satisfaction with their MAPFRE health insurance (69 percent). They were least satisfied with counseling services, with 58 percent responding

satisfied or very satisfied. The other two categories, student activities and Berklee medical assistance team, received 65 percent and 61 percent satisfaction, respectively.

Academic services and technology

Respondents were satisfied with their experiences with academic services and technology, with an average satisfaction rate of 75 percent across all aspects of this area. Eighty-three percent expressed satisfaction with studios and the equipment room, and 80 percent with the ensemble and practice rooms. Respondents ranked technology labs and the scoring stage slightly lower (76 and 78 percent).

Library facilities or services

On average, 80 percent of graduates from Valencia indicated being satisfied or very satisfied with the library facilities or services. The areas with the highest satisfaction include helpfulness of library staff (91 percent), printing (89 percent), and availability of computers (86 percent). Respondents were least satisfied with the range of databases (64 percent) and the library environment (73 percent).

Career services and faculty advisor

Graduate students in Valencia reported a 61 percent average satisfaction rate with the services offered by the International Career Center in Valencia. Respondents were most satisfied with advising sessions (75 percent) and workshops and events (70 percent) and less satisfied with job and/or internship opportunities (48 percent) and performance opportunities (48 percent).

In addition, graduates were asked to rank their satisfaction with their faculty advisor. Seventy-six percent report being satisfied or very satisfied.

Diversity and Inclusion

Graduates from Valencia were asked about their level of agreement and disagreement with two questions about campus diversity and inclusion. On average, the majority of students (89 percent) agree or strongly agree that they are treated with respect and feel comfortable expressing their thoughts and opinions with fellow students, faculty, staff and administration,

and members of the general community. Respondents reported feeling slightly more comfortable in this regard with fellow students (92 percent) than with faculty (85 percent).

On average, 75 percent of respondents agree or strongly agree that they feel confident they could discuss if they were being treated disrespectfully, or talk about a situation or interaction that made them uncomfortable, with fellow students, faculty, staff and administration, or members of the general community. Respondents reported feeling more comfortable in doing so with fellow students (86 percent) and staff and administrators (76 percent), than with faculty (71 percent) or members of the general community (69 percent).

Just over one-third (35 percent) of respondents from the Boston Conservatory at Berklee reported their primary activity as employed, self-employed, or in an internship and twenty-seven percent are continuing their education, which is approximately three times the rate of the college. Almost one-third of respondents from the Conservatory are seeking employment.

Employment and internships

The 18 respondents who selected "employed" as their primary activity were asked specific questions about their employment. Sixty-nine percent of these respondents are employed in full-time positions, and 31 percent in part-time positions. Three-fourths of those employed are paid an hourly wage. One of the graduates who is paid annually and five who are paid hourly shared their compensation information. Of these respondents, the median hourly wage is \$30.00/hour, and the average is \$28.03/hour. A full list of employers and job titles is available in Appendix D.

Performing arts-related employment

Continuing education

Twenty-eight respondents (27 percent) selected continuing education as their primary activity after graduation. Over two-thirds of these respondents are enrolled in other degree/certificate programs, while 14 percent are enrolled in another master's degree program, and 18 percent in a doctoral program. Fifteen respondents are moving on to additional programs at the Boston Conservatory at Berklee. A full list of schools and programs are included in Appendix E.

Professional representation

In addition to immediate career plans, graduates were asked if they have professional representation such as an agent or manager. Six percent of respondents currently have professional representation, similar to graduates from the college.

Career Center

As a result of the merger, Boston Conservatory at Berklee students were able to access Berklee College of Music's resources in the Career Center, but unable to access the technology. Thirty-three percent of respondents reported using Career Center services, resources, and/or programs, and 12 percent used the Career Center more than once per semester. Sixty-one percent of respondents never used the Career Center.

On average, there was a 42 percent satisfaction³ rate with student services at the Boston Conservatory at Berklee. Forty-five percent of responses were neutral, and the remaining 13 percent were dissatisfied. The areas with the highest satisfaction include registrar's office (65 percent), wellness services (56 percent), bursar/billing and financial aid (both 54 percent). Areas with the highest dissatisfaction include room reservations (29 percent dissatisfaction), bursar/billing (19 percent), and financial aid (19 percent).

Regarding facilities, half of graduates were satisfied with the Boston Conservatory at Berklee facilities overall. Forty-one percent of the responses were neutral, and the remaining 19 percent

Summary

The results from the graduate exit surveys provide a valid snapshot of the 2017 graduating class, their immediate post-graduation plans, and their experiences at both Berklee College of Music and at the Boston Conservatory at Berklee. More than half of the college graduate respondents and over a third of the Conservatory respondents reported their primary activity after graduation as employed, self-employed, or in an internship. Nearly a third of Conservatory graduates are continuing their education. Graduates felt very positively about their institution and how it prepared them for their career. More than three-fourths are both generally satisfied with how well their graduate program prepared them for the next stage in their career, and are likely to recommend their institution to others.
